## Rosenthal Project Business Support

Following the results of local community and businesses consultations in 2016, Council made a commitment to offer retail support and development activities during the Rosenthal Project.

In April and May 2017 Council introduced the construction builder, ADCO, to local businesses via face to face visits within the Village. The primary aim was to establish a database of contact details for local businesses to help keep them informed about the Rosenthal Project.

In June 2017 Council sought expressions of interest from community and business representatives to help form the Rosenthal Project Community Liaison Group. The group which consists of local business owners, landowners and managing agents continues to meet during throughout the Project.

In August 2017 Council invited the business community to attend information sessions in the lead up to the start of the Project's construction. At this meeting Council introduced its business support consultants, RDG Insights. The experts from RDG Insights provided free, one-on-one sessions to local businesses over a six week period. They continued to work with a number of local businesses to identify opportunities for improvement in the lead up to Christmas 2017.

Council has provided local businesses with a Parking Brochure and map to help discuss alternate parking arrangements with customers. A similar map has been produced to assist delivery vehicles who may seek alternate locations during the construction period.

A Business Parking scheme has also been developed to help those staff who were parking in the Rosenthal Avenue Car Park (staff from local businesses were accounting for approximately 25% of the use of the Rosenthal Avenue Car Park). The permit scheme is based on a three-monthly cycle by random draw. The recipients can utilise designated business parking spaces in Sera Street (behind Coles) which are located in what was an underutilised parking area.

Council will continue to run initiatives through its Love Where You Shop - Lane Cove campaign.

In 2018 Council held a successful Small Business Breakfast with two more planned for 2019.

In 2019 Council is introducing a Shop Local Gift Card to help promote a culture of shopping locally.
